RELIGIOUS QUOTE OF THE WEEK

"Christ the Great Stone" (Matt. 21:42): Christ is called a stone for two reasons. First, because his foundation is solid and no one who stands upon him will fall victim to deceitful charms or be moved by the storms of persecution. Second, Christ is called a stone because in him is the ultimate destruction of the wicked, for just as everything which collides with a stone is shattered while the stone itself remains intact, so also everyone who opposes the Christian faith will himself be ruined, but Christianity will remain untouched. This is the sense in which Christ is the great stone. 'Whoever falls on it will be broken to pieces, but it will crush those upon whom it falls.'"

RCIA CLASSES FOR 2017-2018 AT IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Classes for this year's RCIA Program will begin on Monday evening, October 16 from 6:30 -7:45 p.m. in the rectory. These classes are for any adult (16 years or older) who has yet to receive what we call the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist), meaning full initiation into the Church. This can be someone who has yet to be baptized, or baptized in a faith tradition not recognized by the Catholic Church, or an individual who has been baptized in the Catholic Church or validly baptized in another faith tradition, but has yet to receive Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation. For anyone who is uncertain about any of the possible situations that exist in their own spiritual life, or that of someone they know where there is an absence of any of the 3 above Sacraments, please speak with Fr. Riley at Mass or call the rectory at 508-754-8419. Each year the RCIA program leads adults to full initiation into the Church at the Easter Vigil Mass, which next year will be March 31, when the reception of the Sacraments will take place.

FROM THE PASTOR

Around New England, October is a month for noticing the great foliage we're blessed to see in Mother Nature. October is also a month when the cooler weather sets in, going from short-sleeve shirts on October 1 or so, to sweatshirts and jackets by the end of the month. Once in a great while, we go from short sleeves early in the month to boots and shovels at the end of the month as we did about 5 years back when we received a major snowstorm around Halloween. And, my personal favorite, October is the month of baseball playoffs. They become much more exciting, of course, when the Red Sox are part of the post-season equation, which they happen to be this year.

In our faith, October is the month dedicated to Mary. Most Catholics, if you asked them what month during the year was dedicated to the Blessed Mother, they would answer the month of May. With May processions and such during the springtime, it's easy to see why most Catholics would guess May as the month of Mary. And they would be correct. It is. But October is also the month we dedicate to Mary's honor and life. On average, the Church celebrates some aspect of Mary's life two times a month. Some months may be three celebrations, while other months may be one. But October is a second month during the Church's year that we dedicate to Our Lady.

With that said, I extend an offer to all our people here at Immaculate Conception who presently do not search and ask for the many graces our Lord offers to us through his most Holy Mother. And offer to create space in our lives where we seek the intercession and prayers of the one who gave birth to the Most High Lord. And to open a new relationship with Mary during this month we dedicate to her life.

I'm sure most of us would agree that we are constantly meeting new people in our lives. When in Ireland a couple weeks ago, all of us on the trip met a number of new people with great Irish accents, beginning with our tour leader Fiona, to our bus driver Damien. When stopping in Dublin and Belfast, and a few Churches along the way, we also met local tour guides who shared their wealth of knowledge about certain parts of Irish history. At Our Lady of Knock, Deacon Kevin, Fr. Adam Reid of our Diocese, and myself met a couple Irish priests who were finishing up their Mass just prior to ours. All the people we met had natural Irish accents. It was fun listening to them speak, while hoping they understood my Lincoln St., Worcester/Boston accent in return. We also met many business owners in shops where some nice Irish items were purchased, and restaurants where good food was consumed. My point is that we meet new people all the time.

So, have you introduced yourself yet to the Queen of Heaven in your spiritual life? Have you established a longstanding, lasting relationship with the number one Lady you will be spending eternity with one day? I can't wait for Blessed Mary to tell me one day in person the entire story of how she gave birth to Christ the Lord in a stable in Bethlehem. "What was Joseph like? Was he nervous in the same way many fathers are nervous at the birth of their children? Did he faint - like some fathers do - during those incredible moments of Salvation himself arriving? Or was he composed the entire time? And, was your child-birth without pain as some theologians teach, or was it normal in human terms?"

So many questions I have for Mary. But I don't want my relationship with the Queen of our Faith to begin the day I die, or the day I make it out of Purgatory. I may not have answers to my many questions about Mary's life until the day I look on the face of God for good. But waiting until that time to establish a loving and close relationship with the one closest to Jesus tells me I could have used my time better in this regard during the course of this short life.
